

### Press Conference to Challenge Defamatory Comments about NCCM | January 28, 2014

In response to defamatory remarks made by the Prime Minister's communications director, NCCM announced that it had served a notice of libel on the offending parties. The conference was held in the Charles Lynch room on Parliament Hill and included NCCM's executive director. Ihsaan Gardee, NCCM legal counsel Nader Hassan, Canadian Council of Muslim Women's representative, Farhat Rehman, and the national coordinator for the International Civil Liberties Monitoring Group (ICLMG)'s, Roch Tasse and Anne Dagenais.

The conference was covered extensively in the national press with stories appearing on the <u>CBC</u>, <u>Globe</u>, <u>Toronto Star</u>, and <u>National Post</u>.

### Press Conference for the Outaouais Gathering | February 5, 2014

NCCM Human Rights Coordinator, Amy Awad, attended the press conference for the Outaouais Gathering for Equality and Freedom of Conscience. Held in the Gatineau City Hall, it launched a declaration against the Quebec Charter of Values.

### Panel Discussion on Quebec Charter of Values | February 18, 2014

### Canadian Muslim Leadership Institute Round Table | Winnipeg, February 26, 2014

For the second year in a row, NCCM was pleased to take part in the CMLI's annual training session for emerging leaders entitled "Women & Leadership."

Amira Elghawaby, while on maternity leave, joined other panelists via videoconferencing to share her experiences as a leader in the Canadian Muslim community.

Her co-panelists were Judy Wasylycia-Leis, former Member of Parliament for Winnipeg-North, and Gertrude Hambira, Secretary General of GAPWUZ (General Agricultural and Plantation Workers' Union of Zimbabwe).

Close to a dozen young people took part in the panel which explored issues around female empowerment, overcoming barriers, and personal resilience.

### ICLMG Semi-Annual General Assembly | Montreal, May 6, 2014

NCCM Executive Director Ihsaan Gardee attended the International Civil Liberties Monitoring Group (ICLMG)'s Semi-Annual General Assembly in Montreal. As a member of ICLMG's Steering Committee and a participant in the meeting NCCM updated the group on some of its work on various issues including its defamation case against the Prime Minister's Office.

Several other issues related to ICLMG's mandate were discussed including various pieces of legislation Bill C-13 (online surveillance) and Bill C-24 (stripping of Canadian citizenship) being pushed through Parliament. ICLMG has endorsed a brief tabled by Lawyers Rights Watch Canada at the UN Human Rights Council, titled Canada: The Shrinking Space for Dissent in Canada. ICLMG signed on to a letter sent to PM Harper on the issue of privacy. The letter was prepared by the team at CIPPIC (a law and technology clinic based at the Centre for Law, Technology & Society at the University of Ottawa's Faculty of Law in Canada) and endorsed by NCCM as well as other major civil liberties groups, academics and privacy organizations. ICLMG also endorsed the "Ottawa Declaration" drafted during the New Transparency Conference (organized by the Surveillance Centre at Queen's) held at Ottawa U. on May 9-10.

The seven-point statement is aimed at improving accountability for state surveillance. It calls for a public process to come up with a comprehensive legal framework for information and privacy rights, building on the Canadian Charter of Rights and UN principles.

### Clothesline Project | Ottawa, May 25, 2014

NCCM, in collaboration with the Women's Event Network (WEN) organized this year's clothesline project in Minto Park in downtown Ottawa. The project gives women, children, and survivors of violence a chance to paint a t-shirt to hang on the line for all to see. These t-shirts represent a public statement about the impact of violence in their lives, and is an important step in the healing journey.

In addition, in order to share the message that ending violence against women is a society



responsibility and not exclusively a private matter, NCCM organized a painting party in its Ottawa office.
