This election we ask for accountability.

All of our political leaders have spent the last two years talking about how Islamophobia, discrimination and hate are unacceptable. Ask your local candidates what they are doing to go beyond words. The safety, security, and dignity of our communities matters.

ASK YOUR LOCAL CANDIDATE:

Q1. What will you do to prevent violent Islamophobic attacks like what happened in London, Toronto, and Quebec City?

NCCM recommends that the federal government take a new approach to hate crimes, new legislation that specifically addresses the challenges of white supremacist groups, and examines the failures of law enforcement, including our national security agencies, in over-policing and under-policing.

Q2. What are you doing to combat systemic Islamophobia in Canada?

NCCM recommends that the federal government establish an Office of the Special Envoy on Islamophobia to tackle systemic Islamophobia in all parts of the government – from the CRA, to our border agencies, to national security.

Q4. How do you intend to make Canada safe and inclusive for all Canadians, regardless of if they wear a hijab, turban or kippah?

NCCM recommends that all federal leaders commit to intervening in legal challenges to Bill 21, a law in Quebec that makes it illegal for those who wear religious symbols such as the hijab, to work in several public sector jobs, including teachers. There should be no place for second-class citizenship in Canada.

Q3. If you are elected, what will you do to address international human rights violations?

NCCM recommends that the government of Canada take clear and immediate action related to the human rights and humanitarian crises in Israel, China and Afghanistan. Go to www.nccm.ca/elections2021 for more.
